

Fair isles prints that boast après ski (LoveShakeFancy and Miu Miu), and the ultimate classic menswear prints such as checks, plaids, and houndstooth that Tory Burch and Kalimba opted for.







The contradiction to the classic prints were the more overt boho prints that graced plenty of runways such as Rentrayage and Ulla Johnson. From moody florals to a retro 70s geo print, we love the contrast!

SHOES THIS

There were two obvious shoe selections made this season (amongst a few others sprinkled in here and there) and one was the tall boot. 

Two words to describe what we feel shined from the Men's Fall Fashion Shows: Elevated basics! From the leather jacket, to the knit polo, to the return of the turtle neck, the Fall runways were filled with these elevated basics. Relaxed tailoring was also noticeable in most runway shows from straight-leg denim to relaxed suiting. Finally, color played a big role also, from bright color in coats and statement knits, to flashes of red, to head-to-toe camel; we are loving all the color!

We know the turtle neck isn't anything new; but we were so inspired by the way the designers were taking this classic sweater and styling under textured sport coats (Brunello Cucinelli & Tom Ford), layering it with an outerwear vest (Brunello Cucinelli), or paring with a patterned overcoat (Dior). The key to this trend is in the styling--let us show you how to do just that, especially if you're unsure of the best look for you!







We mentioned color in our introduction and one of the mostly used colors this season was RED! From streetwear (Boss), to suits (Casablanca), to outerwear (Ermenegildo Zegna), splashes of red are here to catch your eye. Our friends at Vogue suggest choosing one item in red and keeping the rest neutral.





Coats are always expected on the Fall runways; however, this season we are most excited about the following three styles... TRENCH COAT. Not just for Spring! We saw several designers sending this American classic down the runway like the new inventive style from Louis Vuitton and the oh-so classic style from Burberry.

LEATHER. Leather is always a staple for F/W and this season we saw it in both overcoats (Ami,Loewe, Prada) and bombers (Tom Ford, Boss). Either style (or both!) will be a great addition to your Fall coat closet.





KNITS

If you aren't ready to put on that stiff dress shirt yet, then this trend will be for you! The knit polo is taking the place of the dress shirt, at least for this season. Don't be too skeptical, you'll still see some of the key elements of your dress shirt (point collars, plackets, buttons) but in elevated fabrications like cashmere and in both great neutrals and bright colors!
